As you are aware there have been some major turnovers and changes in personnel. The biggest changes have been in senior administration with the retirement of Chief Administrative Officer Shirley Bateman after thirty plus years of dedicated service. With Shirley's retirement Council decided that in response to the increasing complexity and demands of the financial aspect of municipal government that we would replace the Assistant Chief Administrator with a Chief Financial Officer (CFO), We are fortunate to have hired Terry Gnida CGA for that position. Terry has extensive experience with municipal audits and he brings that experience to the town operations. Julie Fothergill has taken over the position of CAO.



New fees for the aquatic centre effective October 1st, 2015:

Daily Admission:

*Family \$23.00
*Adult 8.00
*Senior (60+) 6.50
*Student 6.50
*Teen (13-17) 6.50
*Child (3-12) 5.25

Effective October 1st, 2015 noncontributing Swan Valley Municipalities will pay the 2nd tier fees for all services and programs at the aquatic centre, with the exception of the *daily admission fees. For all other fees, a two tiered fee structure will be implemented in order to reflect the continued contribution to operation costs that taxpayers of the Town of Swan River and the Municipality of Swan Valley West are making towards the facility through their property taxes. All residents of the Swan Valley not from the two contributing municipalities will not be eligible for the discounted fees.

Residents/taxpayers of the Town of Swan River and the Municipality of Swan Valley West will be eligible for 50% discounted rates upon proof of residency. When you attend the facility, please bring along your proof of residency. There are some changes coming to the Aquatic Centre this fall.

1.Shut down — Indoor facilities are typically shut down once a year to perform annual maintenance that cannot be done while there are patrons in the facility. We will be doing an annual shut down in September of every year. This year, the facility will be shut down from September 8 — September 20 inclusive.

2.Swim lessons – Over the past year, many classes were cancelled or combined due to lack of registrations. We understand that this was frustrating for parents trying to plan schedules in advance. We have reduced the number of classes offered this fall.

Lessons we will be offering:

Once a week class on Mondays after school beginning on September 28

Twice a week class on Tuesdays & Thursdays after school beginning on September 29 & November 3

Once a week class on Saturdays mornings beginning October 3

Please see the lesson schedule for more details.

3.Aqua Fit – This has been one of our most popular programs happening at the Centre and we want to be able offer as many classes as possible. Becoming a certified aqua fit instructor is a process which takes some time. We currently have staff in training but we are losing 3 instructors to university this fall and therefore we will not be able to keep up the current schedule. As soon the new instructors have finished the certification process, we will add back the classes. This fall, we will be

offering aqua fit on Wednesday & Friday at 8 am, Monday, Wednesday & Friday at 1 pm, and Tuesdays & Thursdays at 7 pm. Mondays at 8 am Saturdays at 9 am will no longer be offered until further notice.

4.New programs —We will be offering a Fun Club for kids ages 7 – 12. It will be held on Wednesdays from 4 – 6 pm and will include an after school snack and lots of pool time to play some games and have fun. Cost will be \$90/child and run September 30 – ??.

Another new program will be *Stroke Correction*. This will be an opportunity for kids and adults to work specifically on their strokes with an instructor. Cost is \$40 and will run during the regular lesson period.

<u>PUBLIC WORKS DEPARTMENT</u> Transportation

2015 - Capital Projects

- 1. New Loader/ Backhoe Following the Town Equipment replacement plan, in early spring 2015 Public Works tendered for a new Loader/Backhoe. The winning tender included a 2015 CASE 580 Super N WT. The Loader Backhoe is one of the Town most used equipment in our fleet.
- 2. 1st St. North Sidewalk Complete late July, landscaping to be complete in early August. It included the installation of a public sidewalk from 13th Ave to Evans Ave. The remainder of the sidewalk from Evans Ave to PTH 10 N will be installed in 2016.
- 3. Asphalt Crushing The Town received crushing prices in January and proceeded to crush 3400yds of used asphalt that has accumulated

over several years. The material is used in back lanes and as a temporary fill for water and sewer excavation repairs.

2015 - Maintenance

Landfill Scale opening – The scale will be operational in August, however, the Town will NOT be charging at the Landfill until fall. We will start charging once we have the fees prepared, the Town will advertise and inform rate payers what to expect for charges at the Landfill prior to the date we start charging.

Curb and gutter repairs/ asphalt patching - all curb repairs must be done prior to the asphalt patching which is scheduled for early September. Roughly 20 areas within Town are to be patched with asphalt pavement.

Utility

2015 - Capital Projects

- 1. Heyes Street Lift Station Upgrade To be complete late fall 2015. Included in the project is a full replacement of mechanical and electrical components, new more efficient grinder pumps to deal with the increased flow to the station. The addition of an electrical building to house the new control center will be added. Monitoring equipment for emergency response as well to track trending data is included. Project is to be complete late fall.
- 2. Lift Station Radio Communication

 Project completed April 2015. All lift station monitoring equipment will report to the Water Treatment plant to inform operators of any non-typical operation of the Lift Stations.
- 3. Radio Water Meter Replacement Currently complete 75% of the Town, new meters will bring more accurate readings and with radio technology decrease labour hours collecting readings.
- 4. Lagoon Feasibility Study Complete July 2015. The Town received several options and a recommendation for the solution to

the issues the Town is facing with the current Lagoon.

2015 - Maintenance

Sewer Main Flushing – The Town will perform its Sewer flushing operations mid-September. Please be cautious when approaching work site vehicles was they will be parked on centerline of the roadway.

Water Main Flushing/Valve exercising – Annual flushing of water mains will take place late September early October. Maintenance records are updated on all hydrants and valves during operation.

Councillor's Corner

As some of you are aware the Swan Valley Credit Union Aquatic Centre will be implementing increased and two tier fees commencing October 1, 2015. Why is this happening you may ask? Well there are a few reasons.

1.Town of Swan River council has received consistent loud feedback from taxpayers/residents of the Town of Swan River that they do not want to be the only tax payers to be shouldered with the operational costs of the facility while the facility is open to everyone. Town Council has heard you.

2. While discussions are ongoing with our Swan Valley G4 Municipalities regarding shared funding for the operational costs, only the Municipality of Swan Valley West has currently agreed to contribute funds thus allowing their taxpayers/residents to be eligible to pay lower fees. If you are from a Swan Valley G4 Municipality who is not currently contributing to the annual operational costs, I invite you to talk to your councillor or Municipal Council. 3.After a year of operating the facility and working out the kinks in commissioning a new building of such size and complexity, we have better numbers to budget with in regards to revenue and operating costs. So there you have it. We have a new magnificent building with excellent staff and programing but we all know it comes at a price. We all want to keep the costs down and generated as much revenue as possible at an affordable price so we can minimize the operational deficit.

So what does this mean for me as a current or future user?

1.Daily admissions will see a modest increase after a careful review of surrounding community pools. Rates were chosen that are very comparable yet affordable for our drop in customers. These rates apply to all daily admissions regardless of residency.

2.All other fees will be two tiered and for a full listing of the current fees for a particular package or program, please take a look at the new 2015/16 Rec & Leisure guide or call the Aquatic Centre. All residents/taxpayers of the noncontributing Swan Valley G4

Municipalities will pay double the listed

fees, with the exception of the daily admission fees.

3.Programing review has been undertaken by staff at the Aquatic Centre this year. The review looked at various programs offered to determine what worked, what didn't and what the attendance numbers were for each program. A new revised program format is being implemented to achieve better efficiencies and better available programs. As always your feedback is appreciated. Thank you,
